The La Vernia City Council was present at the Planning and Zoning Commission Regular Meeting on January 7, 2014 at 6:30 p.m. at City Hall, La Vernia, Texas.

The Planning and Zoning Commission meeting was called to order at 6:31 p.m. and all Commissioners were present.

Item No. 1. <u>Call to Order</u> Mayor Robert Gregory called the meeting to order at 6:59 p.m. Council members present were Marie Gerlich, Randy Leonard, Eloi Cormier, and Jennifer Moczygemba. Staff members present were City Secretary-Treasurer Angela Cantu and Police Chief Bruce Ritchey. City Attorney Jameene Banks was also present.


Item No 2. <u>Consent Agenda</u> A motion was made by Dianell Recker and seconded by Viola Robles to accept the minutes of the November 4, 2013 Special Meeting, November 4, Joint Workshop and December 3, 2013 Joint Workshop. **Motion Passed.**

Item No 3. Public Hearing and Discussion/Action.

- **A.** Public Hearing to receive comments on the proposed amendments to the comprehensive zoning regulations of the City of La Vernia: Article I. In General, Article II. Zoning Districts, Article III. Permitted Uses, and Article IV. Supplemental Regulations; and the City's official zoning map. Chairman Gordon Bake opened the public hearing at 6:41. There were no citizens to be heard regarding the comprehensive zoning amendments. At 6:42, Gordon introduced Mayor Robert Gregory to discuss the overlay district with the group of citizens attending the meeting. Jameene Banks asked permission to give a legal explanation of what an overlay district is as stated by the state and what the city is allowed. Mayor Gregory stressed to the citizens that the overlay district was strictly to exempt the listed streets from the new masonry standards that could be passed. At 6:55 Chairman Gordon Bake opened the floor for public comments. Jennifer Moczygemba called for a point of order and asked Mayor Gregory to call the City Council to order because they had a quorum present. The citizens heard were as follows:
 - 1. Susan Richter said she needed more information on the overlay district before agreeing.
 - 2. Kathy Volkmann spoke against overlay district.
 - 3. David Freeman wants more information about overlay district, but is not opposed.
 - 4. Fay Brietzke was worried about future development of her property.
 - 5. Councilman Leonard assured the citizens that this was a good thing.
 - 6. Wally Watson spoke against the overlay district.
 - 7. Tommy Scoggin wanted more information on overlay district.
 - 8. Bobby Santos wanted more information on overlay district.
 - 9. Galean Rasmusson wanted more information on overlay.
 - 10. Anita Stone, Beverly Simmons, and Tim Brooks signed up to speak, but decided not to.
 - 11. Keith Johanson spoke against masonry ordinance.

Mayor Gregory said that he would be willing to postpone the vote so that the residents have time to look over the proposed ordinance changes. Commissioner Martin Poore discussed the overlay district. The public hearing was closed at 7:25. Chairman Gordon Bake excused citizens that did not want to stay for the remainder of the meeting.
