

**ORDINANCE NO. 100820-01**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LA VERNIA, TEXAS AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 021209-05 REGULATING THE PRIMA FACIE MAXIMUM SPEED LIMITS DURING SCHOOL ZONE HOURS ON FM 1346 SOUTH; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR REPEALING, SAVINGS AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSES; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE.**

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of La Vernia, Texas finds it necessary to amend Ordinance No. 021209-05 to coordinate the opening of a new school and to coordinate with the change in school attendance times and to establish maximum speed limits within the areas and at the locations named and designated in the body of this Ordinance, during periods of time, which shall be set by the Texas Department of Transportation, when the schools are in session and school children are going to and from schools and playgrounds, and the alternating flashing warning lights are activated; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council finds that it is necessary for the protection and safety of pedestrians crossing streets in school areas to establish maximum speed limits and to prohibit the overtaking and passing of motor vehicles within the school zone; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council has investigated and determined that it would be advantageous and beneficial to the citizens of the City to amend Ordinance No. 021209-05 as set forth below.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNIA, TEXAS:**

**SECTION 1. THAT ORDINANCE NO. 021209-05 AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1. Establishment of school crossing zone.**

**“School Zones”**

- a) *Vehicle speed and operation generally:* It shall be unlawful for any person to operate or drive any vehicle at a speed greater than the speed designated or posted, or to overtake or pass any other vehicle in any school zone as may be marked or designated within the City during the hours of 7 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. to 4:45 p.m., or whenever children are present in such zones, or when such zones have an alternating flashing light in operation.
- b) *Speed limits:* The following prima facie maximum speed limits hereinafter indicated for motor vehicles are hereby determined and declared to be reasonable and safe. Such maximum speed limits are hereby fixed at the rate of speed indicated for motor vehicles traveling upon the main street or highway, or parts of the main street or highway, and no motor vehicle shall be operated along or upon such portions of the named streets or

highways within the corporate limits of the City in excess of the speeds set forth as follows:

- 1) Twenty-five (25) miles per hour on school days, on FM 1346 South:
  - a. From a point of 200 feet east of the east driveway of the La Vernia Independent School District Intermediate School, to a point of 636 feet west of the driveway of the retail center located at 226 FM 1346 South.

## **SECTION 2. RELATION TO OTHER ORDINANCES.**

This ordinance shall not be construed to require or allow any act which is prohibited by any other ordinance. This ordinance is specifically subordinate to any ordinance or regulations of the City of La Vernia pertaining to building and construction safety or to pedestrian and traffic safety.

## **SECTION 3. SAVINGS CLAUSE.**

The repeal or amendment of any ordinance or part of ordinances effectuated by the enactment of this ordinance shall not be construed as abandoning any action now pending under or by virtue of such ordinance or as discontinuing, abating, modifying, or altering any penalty accruing or to accrue or as affecting any rights of the City of La Vernia under any section or provisions of any ordinances in effect at the time of passage of this ordinance.

## **SECTION 4. CUMULATIVE.**

The provisions of this ordinance shall be cumulative of all ordinances not repealed by this ordinance and ordinances governing or regulating the same subject matter as that covered herein. This ordinance shall not be construed to require or allow any act which is prohibited by any other ordinance.

## **SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY.**

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and section of this ordinance be severable, and, if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this ordinance shall be declared invalid by judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or sections of this ordinance and the remainder of this ordinance shall be enforced as written.

## **SECTION 6. PROPER NOTICE AND MEETING.**

It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was passed was open to the public and that public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551 of the Texas Government Code. Notice was also provided as required by Chapter 52 of the Texas Local Government Code.

**SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE**

This Ordinance shall become effective and shall be in full force upon adoption and publication.

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LA VERNIA, TEXAS AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 081414-05 REGULATING THE PRIMA FACIE MAXIMUM SPEED LIMITS DURING SCHOOL ZONE HOURS ON BLUEBONNET STREET; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR REPEALING, SAVINGS AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSES; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE.**

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of La Vernia, Texas finds it necessary to amend Ordinance No. 081414-05 to coordinate with the change in school attendance times and to establish maximum speed limits within the areas and at the locations named and designated in the body of this Ordinance and during the periods of time specified herein; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council finds that it is necessary for the protection and safety of children and other pedestrians crossing streets in school areas to establish maximum speed limits and to prohibit the overtaking and passing of motor vehicles within the school zones; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council has investigated and determined that it would be advantageous and beneficial to the citizens of the City to amend Ordinance No. 081414-05as set forth below.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNIA, TEXAS:**

**SECTION 1. THAT ORDINANCE NO. 081414-05 IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1. Establishment of school crossing zone.**

**“School Zones”**

- a) *Vehicle speed and operation generally:* It shall be unlawful for any person to operate or drive any vehicle at a speed greater than the speed designated or posted, or to overtake or pass any other vehicle in any school zone as may be marked or designated within the City during the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m., or whenever children are present in such zones, or when such zones have an alternating flashing light in operation.
  
- b) *Speed limits:* The following prima facie maximum speed limits hereinafter indicated for motor vehicles are hereby determined and declared to be reasonable and safe. Such maximum speed limits are hereby fixed at the rate of speed indicated for motor vehicles traveling upon the main street or highway, or parts of the main street or highway, and no motor vehicle shall be operated along or upon such portions of the named streets or highways within the corporate limits of the City in excess of the speeds set forth as follows:



1) Twenty-five (25) miles per hour on school days, and as otherwise specified in section 1 (a) of this ordinance, on Bluebonnet Street:

a. From a point of 100 feet Northeast of the intersection of DL Vest and FM 775 (Bluebonnet Street) and a point 100 feet Southwest of the intersection of the school property and to FM 775 (Bluebonnet Street).

2) The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to erect speed limit signs reflecting the above changed school zone hours in accordance with this ordinance.

## **SECTION 2. RELATION TO OTHER ORDINANCES.**

This ordinance shall not be construed to require or allow any act which is prohibited by any other ordinance. This ordinance is specifically subordinate to any ordinance or regulations of the City of La Vernia pertaining to building and construction safety or to pedestrian and traffic safety.

## **SECTION 3. SAVINGS CLAUSE.**

The repeal or amendment of any ordinance or part of ordinances effectuated by the enactment of this ordinance shall not be construed as abandoning any action now pending under or by virtue of such ordinance or as discontinuing, abating, modifying, or altering any penalty accruing or to accrue or as affecting any rights of the City of La Vernia under any section or provisions of any ordinances in effect at the time of passage of this ordinance.

## **SECTION 4. CUMULATIVE.**

The provisions of this ordinance shall be cumulative of all ordinances of the City of La Vernia and to the extent of any conflict with other ordinances, such conflicting ordinances are hereby repealed. . This ordinance shall not be construed to require or allow any act which is prohibited by any other ordinance.

## **SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY.**

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and section of this ordinance be severable, and, if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this ordinance shall be declared invalid by judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or sections of this ordinance and the remainder of this ordinance shall be enforced as written.

## **SECTION 6. PROPER NOTICE AND MEETING.**

It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was passed was open to the public and that public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551 of the

**RESOLUTION NO. R100820-01**

**AN RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNIA, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OR PERSON SO DESIGNATED BY THE CITY COUNCIL TO UNDERTAKE ALL EFFORTS NECESSARY TO FACILITATE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF LEGISLATURE WHICH WILL FURTHER AUTHORIZE THE DIVISION OF LOTTERY REVENUE; AND TO RETAIN THE SERVICES OF A LOBBYIST AND/OR A LOBBYING FIRM TO ASSIST IN SAID ENDEAVOR WITH THE FEES TO BE DIVIDED AMONG ALL CITIES AND COUNTIES WHO JOIN IN THE PASSING OF THE INTENDED LEGISLATURE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE**

**WHEREAS**, on August 26, 1991, House Bull (HB) 54, creating lottery in Texas, was passed during the 72<sup>nd</sup> Legislature;

**WHEREAS**, on November 5, of the same year, House Joint Resolution (HJR) 8, containing the constitutional amendment to authorize a state lottery, was approved by Texas voters;

**WHEREAS**, the Texas Lottery Commission reported that as of August 31, 2019, over \$6,251,487,651 revenue had been generated;

**WHEREAS**, Texas families have benefit from the Texas Lottery's revenue contributions such as 25.8% to Texas Education (Foundation School Fund) and 0.3% Fund for Veterans Assistance and Other State Programs;

**WHEREAS**, the City Council for the City of La Vernia contends that there are interested in undertaking efforts to ascertain the implementation of legislature that will further authorize the further division of lottery revenues to cities and counties;

**WHEREAS**, the City Council for the City of La Vernia further recognizes the fact that it is necessary that in order to enact this special legislature, it is important to designate the Mayor or a designated agent and/or employee whom they shall appoint to undertake all efforts necessary to facilitate the implementation of legislature;

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor or designated agent and/or employee shall have the authority to retain the services of a lobbyist and/or lobbying firm to assist the county and or cities in navigating through these issues;

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of La Vernia recognizes that in order to achieve this goal, it is necessary to authorize the Mayor or its designated agent to create a

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNIA:**

2. That the Mayor and/or the designated agent shall have the authority to advertise for the possible employment of a lobbyist and/or lobbying firm, and to submit said resumes for consideration to the La Vernia City Council;
3. That the Mayor and/or the designated agent shall have the authority to contact other cities and counties to inquire as to their interest to join in the endeavor.

This Resolution shall take effect immediately from and after the date of passage and is so resolved.

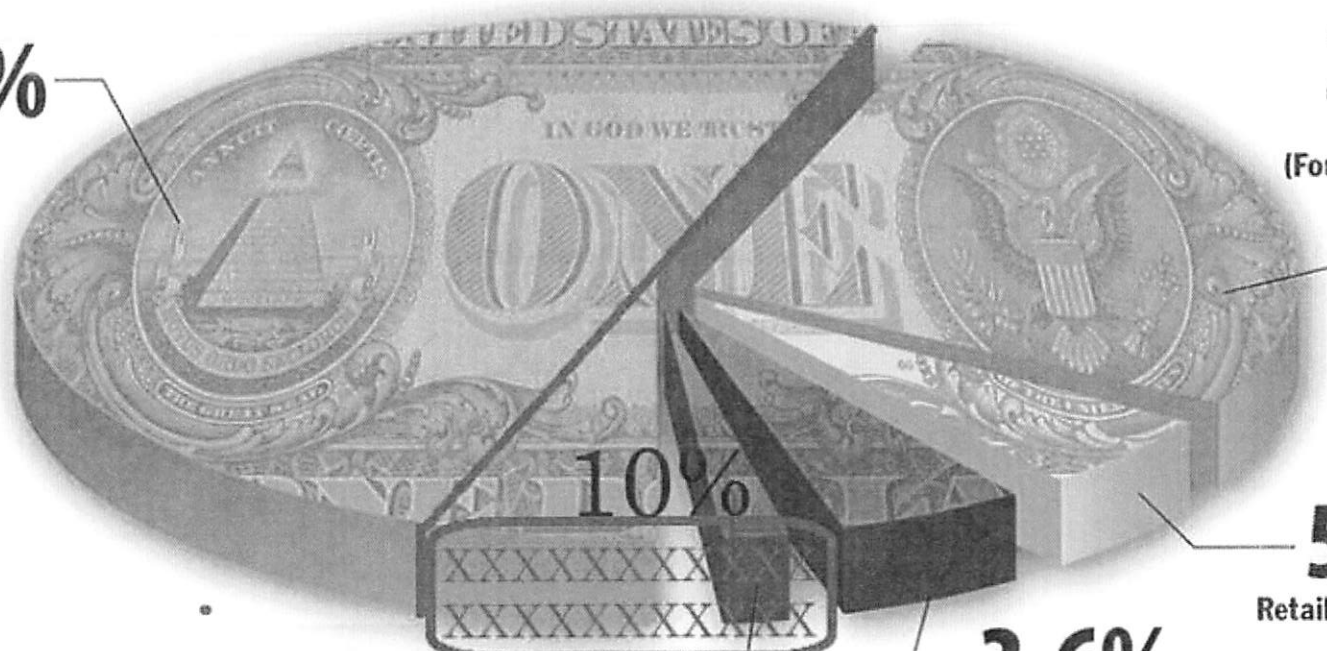
