February 25, 2021 6:30 PM

Minutes

- **1. Call to Order** Mayor Pro-Tem Poore called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM and declared a quorum. All members were present.
- 2. Citizens to be Heard there were no citizens to be heard.

3. Consent Agenda

(All consent agenda items are considered routine by City Council and will be enacted by one motion. There will be no separate discussion of these items unless a Councilmember requests an item be removed and considered separately.)

A. Minutes from the February 11, 2021 Regular City Council Meeting

MOTION: Councilman Hennette made a motion to approve the consent agenda as presented, seconded by Councilman Oates. Motion passes: 5-0.

4. Discussion

A. Discussion on 4th of July celebration in the park for 2021 to include entertainment, budget and cancellation.

Councilman Hennette spoke on behalf of the President for MDD and advised their recommendation would be to have a firework show only display only on July 4th. Mayor Pro Tem stated he sat in on meeting and the one thing that caught his attention was that we may have a contract with entertainer. Concerns raised by members were how much are we going to be out of pocket, what are the refunds looking like, do we risk moving forward with chances of losing deposits, couple of months behind schedule — late to need on planning, enforcing masks and COVID regulations, would we have staff to work.

Members would like to hear if entertainer will request monies from the city even if canceled. Email was sent to entrainer will be in touch with council once we receive word.

B. Discuss and consider recruiting members for the Planning and Zoning Committee.

Mayor Pro Tem Poore stated that we have two vacant positions. Current members are
Commissioner Bake, Commissioner Tanneberger and Commissioner Robles.

Councilwoman Recker stated she would think about it over night and send an email to
staff if she comes up with something. Councilman Oates stated he was going to send a
few messages out and would reach out to and get with staff in regards to it.

5. Discussion/Action

 Discuss and consider action on approval of replacement copiers with Knight Office.

Mayor Pro Tem stated cover sheet and good information in packet provided by City Administrator.

MOTION: Councilman Oates made a motion to replacement copiers with Knight Office, seconded by Councilwoman Recker. **Motion passes: 5-0.**

- B. Discuss and consider action on approval of creation of Waggin' Tails Dog Park located in City Park.
 - a. Maintenance
 - b. Funding

Martin stated his biggest concern was the proximity to the disk golf, afraid given the distance that is there, thinking 30', being thrown into the dog park however he stated he did not have heart burn over what was presented. Councilwoman Recker asked if the city had to share any special liability to this and the answer was no. Gretch, with Waggin' Tails Dog Park Coalition, stated that once the boundaries were set with the dog park she said they were to have 15' from the disk golf however where they established their boundaries it ended up being between 30-35', overall the final draw out shows approx. 40'. Councilman Oates stated he had personally played disk golf a couple of times, and knowing where the boundaries are he sees the concerns but the signs around the park regarding the disk golf would cover the city. He also stated his biggest concern is since this is going on city property, he reviewed the packet and it appears that the sun shade covers showed turquoise. Per Mayor Pro Tem, he stated they were going to comply with the same colors through out the park. Gretch was advised to ensure that she complied with the colors to match throughout the park, which were confirmed by staff to be Aqua Blue.

MOTION: Councilman Hennette made a motion to approve the Waggin' Tails Dog park, seconded by Councilman Oates. **Motion passes: 5-0**.

C. Discuss and consider action on approval of forming a parks committee to assist with Little League, baseball/softball field and use fees.

Mayor Pro Tem stated this committee will also go to a uniform vision for the park and overall plan, his thoughts will start at as himself, Jay, Yvonne and David. They will lay some ground work and then bring other folks in on the committee once the ground work is laid. It is not going to be a one and done, it is going to be a long-range plan on the park. Coucnilman Hennette stated he wanted to put this on record, since there is difficulty getting volunteers, look to establish a Parks and Recreations Director — a paid position. Mayor Pro Tem stated that would be a discussion item during the meetings that will be worked into everything.

MOTION: Councilman Hennette made a motion to approve forming a parking committee, seconded by Councilwoman Hutchinson. **Motion passes: 5-0.**

D. Discuss and consider action on approval of CEC schedule for FY 2021 Street Projects.

MOTION: Councilman Oates made a motion to approve FY 2021 Street Project, seconded by Councilwoman Recker. **Motion passed: 5-0**.

E. Discuss and consider purchase of aerator for the Sewer Plant located on River Rd.

MOTION: Councilman Hennette made a motion to purchase the aerator, seconded by Councilwoman Hutchinson. **Motion passes: 5-0**.

F. Discuss and consider moving forward with obtaining grants for creation of walking trail on city owed property located between Industrial Drive and Forrest Dr.

Councilwoman Hutchinson asked if this was going where the gun range is and back in the brush. City Administrator stated that we are working with SARA in which they are going to provide a map to us. It will not be walking trails near the gun range. This will include a fence and signs near gun range, to stay clear of there. Councilwoman asked where they were going to enter from, goal is to enter from Industrial as they do not want any access through neighborhoods.

MOTION: Councilman Hennette made a motion to approve moving forward with seconded by Councilman Oates. **Motion passes: 4-1**.

G. Discuss and consider action on approval of an agreement with the La Vernia Market to permit them to use a portion of city property for Market Days. City Administrator advised this is the property across the street from where Market Days is, they would like to have donkey and wagon rides through the piece of City owned property. Mr. Robbins, not present at meeting, stated he would maintain the property however City Administrator did advise it would have to be an agreement done year by year.

MOTION: Councilman Oates made a motion to move forward with an agreement with Market Days, seconded by Councilwoman Recker. **Motion passes: 5-0**.

H. Discuss and consider action on approval to move forward with an TxDot application for sidewalk creation along San Antonio.

Councilman Oates stated he drove the route and a lot of the area has sidewalks in it just needs repairs but wanted to confirm if it was one side or both sides and it would be one side on San Antonio Rd. Sidewalks will connect. He also stated DL Vest has a side walk however the other side does not, however on the commercial side it would have two breaks with the apartments/storage and Art Attack. He thought it would be more beneficials to do San Antonio Rd all the way to US Hwy 87. Councilman Hennette asked when we apply do we have to give specific linear ft? City Administrator stated that we are in the preliminary stages and in our master plan/comprehensive plan it did have this in there. At DL Vest and San Antonio, we are working in to have crosswalks in as staff did state the concerns were heard.

MOTION: Councilman Hennette made a motion to approve moving forward with a TxDOT application for sidewalk creation along San Antonio, seconded by Councilwoman Hutchinson. **Motion passes: 5-0.**

Mayor Gregory,

Three (3) bids were received on March 19, 2021 for the above referenced project as shown in Table 1 below. CEC has reviewed and tabulated the three bids (see attached Bid Tabulation Form). The submitted bid for the apparent low bidder (All In Construction) meets the bid submittal requirements, qualification requirements, and specified bidding procedures.

Table 1 – Bid Results

The apparent low bidder is **All In Construction** with a total Bid of \$471,209.46, which is approximately 33% higher than the engineer's estimated probable construction costs. Current uncertainties within the materials and transportation industries in addition to rising fuel costs may be justification for the increased bid amounts above the Engineer's estimated values. A majority of the materials used on street maintenance projects include petroleum-based products and require transportation in which costs have been increasing over the past few months. The Engineer's estimate utilized past bids on similar projects and TxDOT Average Unit Bid Prices to estimate probable construction costs which are not always indicative of future costs.

The bid quantities and extended costs presented on the All In Construction bid proposal have been reviewed and minor calculations errors were identified. The submitted bid proposal presented a bid total of \$471,534.22; however, after recalculating their line item totals based on their unit bid prices, the bid total calculates to \$471,209.46. In general, the unit prices submitted by All In Construction are within acceptable limitations to the engineer's estimated values given the current market uncertainties.

All In Construction submitted a Qualifications Statement during the bidding process. Projects listed as references demonstrate recent and similar work for municipalities within the state of Texas including street maintenance projects for the City of St. Hedwig, San Antonio, La Vernia, and Floresville. The Qualifications demonstrated by All In Construction meet the qualifications and experience required by the project documents.

Based on our analysis of the bids received, CEC recommends awarding the contract to All In Construction accordingly.

Yvonne,

Good morning. Attached are the bid results for the 2021 Streets Project along with our recommendation to award the contract to the lowest bidder – All In Construction.

Bids came in a bit higher than we anticipated. We think the rising costs of petroleum products and fuel are likely contributors to the higher costs.

I assume the City will still want to award the contract to All In Construction so let me know and I will notify them accordingly and prepare the Notice of Award and Contract.

Please feel free to call for further discussion.

There is one item in the bids that we should discuss whether to keep or remove. The plan included installing a moisture barrier (bid as concrete header curb) along both sides of the pavement low area on CR 342.

The barrier will help protect the roadway section in this area but the costs are adding \$52,647 to the contract. We could save a chunk and bring the project more in line to the City's anticipated costs.

RIGHT OF WAY EASEMENT

THE STATE OF TEXAS, COUNTY OF WILSON

That the Undersigned, The City of LaVernia, a Municipal Corporation (hereinafter referred to as Grantor) for a good and valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant unto GUADALUPE VALLEY ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE, INC. (hereinafter referred to as GVEC), a cooperative corporation, whose post office address is P.O. Box 118, Gonzales, Texas 78629, and to its successors or assigns, an easement for the purpose of erection, construction, reconstruction, replacement, removal, maintenance and use of one or more electric distribution lines, fiber optic and other communications equipment, (collectively "Facilities") for the transmission of electricity and communications upon and over the lands of the undersigned, and more particularly described as follows: Being 1.84 acres of land, more or less out of the Juan Delgado survey, A-8, identified as parcel number 11302, and being the same land described in a deed from Camile Fryar Franklin, etal to The City of LaVernia, dated the 7th day of November, 1974, of record in Volume 472, Page 135 of the Official Records of Real Property of Wilson County, Texas.

See Exhibit "A" attached hereto and made a part of this easement

GVEC shall have all rights necessary for the full use herein granted, including, but not limited to, the right of ingress and egress for pedestrians, equipment and vehicles over Grantor's adjacent lands to and from said right-of-way for the purpose of constructing said Facilities, including the installation of a variable number of guy wires, anchors, and appurtenances as needed, improving, reconstructing, upgrading, repairing, inspecting, patrolling, installing, said Facilities on Grantor's land described above, operating, maintaining, providing adequate clearances and removing said Facilities, over, under, and upon said land, and the right to remove, trim, cut down or chemically treat with herbicides, trees or shrubbery or parts thereof within 15 feet of said Facilities or any other obstructions which may endanger, interfere or impair the efficiency, safety or convenient operation of said Facilities and their appurtenances. Grantor shall not construct any structure or improvement, nor impound any water, nor place any temporary or permanent erection of any mast-type equipment or appurtenances nearer than 15 feet to Facilities in any manner as to conflict with the National Electric Safety Code or any applicable law, as either of the same now exists or may be amended in the future, and this restriction shall be a covenant running with the land. Such prohibited construction within the easement shall include but not be limited to new construction or major modification to a preexisting habitable structure, as well as, stock tanks, swimming pools, spas, water wells or oil wells including construction both above and below existing grade.



TEMPORARY LICENSE AND MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT

This License Agreement ("Agreement") is made as of the 8th day of April 2021, by and between the City of La Vernia, Texas, a body politic and corporate existing under the laws of the State of Texas, ("City" or "Licensor"), and Wayne Robbins owner of La Vernia Market Days ("Licensee"), (collectively, "Parties").

BACKGROUND

WHEREAS, Licensor, as the fee owner, is responsible for the land upon which Licensee desires to offer certain services during La Vernia Market Days ("Parcel") and more specifically depicted and described in Exhibit "A", attached hereto and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, Licensee has a need to access and use a portion of the Parcel for mule rides provided by a third party contractor, Troy Owen, Wolfe Creek Wagon Company ("Project") as set forth in the contract between Licensee and third party contractor attached hereto as Exhibit "B"; and,

WHEREAS, Licensee wishes to obtain a license agreement ("License") from Licensor for a portion or portions of the Parcel for the Project and to make ready and maintain the area and Licensor is willing to grant such License over an area more particularly shown on Exhibit "C" ("License Area") solely for the permitted use set forth in this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, Licensor is authorized to enter into this Agreement pursuant to action taken by the City Council on April 8, 2021("Resolution"), a copy of which is attached as Exhibit "D"; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein, and other valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, Licensor and Licensee, intending to be legally bound, agree as follows:

Section 1. Incorporation of Recitals and Attachments.

The recitals above are hereby incorporated herein as if set forth in full. The attachments to this Agreement are deemed to be a part hereof.

Section 2. Grant of License.

- (a) Licensor hereby grants to Licensee the License as follows
 - (i) Location: Licensee is authorized to use the License Area,

identified on Exhibit "C".

- (ii) Purpose: Licensee is authorized to use the License Area for the Project and such use shall include, but is not limited to, use of the License Area for the make ready and maintenance of the Licensed Area for mule rides conducted by third party contractor in accordance with Exhibit B, and for no other purpose.
 - (iii) Duration. As provided in Section 3 below.
- (b) Licensee shall reasonably restore the area upon the termination of the License.
- (c) Licensee shall, at all times, coordinate with Licensor in a reasonable manner on all matters relating to the License.

Section 3. Term.

The term of the License shall be for a period of one (1) year with an opportunity to renew for two additional one year terms upon written agreement between the Parties and in accordance with Section 13 below. ("Term").

Section 4. Consideration.

In consideration for the rights and privileges set forth in this Agreement, Licensee shall maintain the License Area and return the area to a condition reasonably similar to the condition of the area prior to the activities of Licensee.

Section 5. Condition of License Area.

Licensor makes no representation or warranty, express or implied, in fact or in law, as to (a) the title to the License Area, (b) any encumbrances, restrictions and conditions which may affect the License Area, (c) the nature, condition or usability of the License Area, including but not limited to the suitability of the License Area for Licensee's use. Licensee is relying on its own independent inspection of the License area in its acceptance of the License and its exercise of the rights granted under this Agreement.

Section 6. Title.

No legal title or leasehold in the License Area other than the License granted by this Agreement, shall be deemed or construed to have been created or vested in Licensee by anything contained in this Agreement.

Section 7. Alterations.

No structures, improvements, renovations, alterations, additions, modifications and/or replacements thereof (collectively referred to herein as "Alterations") shall be affixed to or located on or about the License Area, except as described in the Project documents, without the prior written consent of Licensor. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Licensee may clear and level the License Area as needed to make the area suitable for the intended use.

Section 8. Maintenance and Repairs.

Licensee shall, at its sole cost and expense, maintain and repair the License Area. Licensor shall have no responsibility whatsoever to maintain or repair the License Area during the term of the Agreement.

Section 9. Liens; Encumbrances.

Licensee shall keep the License Area and/or the real estate affected by such License free and clear of all liens, claims and encumbrances resulting or arising from rights given to Licensee under this Agreement, any work or act performed by, or materials furnished by Licensee or any party claiming by, through or under Licensee, or any party under Licensee's direction or in privity of contract with Licensee.

Section 10. No Consent.

Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed in any way as constituting the consent or request of Licensor, express or implied, to any contractor, subcontractor, laborer or materialman for the performance of any labor or the furnishing of any materials on, in and/or about the License Area, nor as giving the Licensee any right, power or authority to contract for or permit the rendering of any services or the furnishing of any materials that would give rise to the filing of any lien against the License Area.

Section 11. Insurance.

- (a) For Licensee to occupy and work upon the License Area, Licensee must possess the insurance set forth below. Licensee, as a qualified self-insurer and instrumentality of the State of Texas, may self-insure the insurance required by this Agreement
 - (1) Workers' Compensation and Employers' Liability.
 - (i) Workers' Compensation: Statutory Limits.
 - (ii) Employers' Liability: \$100,000 Each Accident Bodily Injury by Accident; \$100,000 Each Employee Bodily Injury by Disease; and \$500,000 Policy Limit Bodily Injury by

Disease.

(2) General Liability Insurance

- (i) Limit of Liability: \$1,000,000 per occurrence combined single limit or bodily injury (including death) and property damage liability; \$1,000,000 advertising injury; \$1,000,000 aggregate for products and completed operations.
- (ii) Coverage: Premises operations; blanket contractual liability; personal injury liability; products and completed operations; independent contractors and employees as additional insureds; cross liability; broad form property damage (including completed operations).
- (b) Prior to commencement of this Agreement, Licensee shall provide the Licensor evidence of insurance or self-insurance. During the Term of this Agreement, Licensee shall provide a demonstration of insurance or self-insurance meeting the foregoing requirements to the Licensor as reasonably required by the Licensor.

Section 12. Indemnification.

Licensee hereby agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless Licensor from all claims, demands, suits, actions, expenses, or liability of any kind or nature whatsoever, brought for or on account of injury to persons (including death) and damage to and loss of property which are caused by Licensee's use and occupancy of the License Area, and to the extent which are due to any act, omission, neglect or misconduct of Licensee's officers, agents, employees, invitees, third party contractors or patrons. It is specifically not intended, however, that Licensee either releases, indemnifies or holds Licensor harmless for damages or injuries to persons (including death) caused by or due to Licensor's own negligence or intentional conduct or otherwise caused by Licensor. Licensee shall also not be liable for indemnifying Licensor against claims by an employee, agent, worker or servant of Licensor, including claims for compensation or benefits payable to any extent by or for Licensor under any worker's or similar compensation acts or other employee acts, or that of its agents, employees, contractors, successors or assigns.

Section 13. Survival.

Any and all agreements set forth in this Agreement which, by its or their nature, would reasonably be expected to be performed after the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement shall survive and be enforceable after the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement. Any and all liabilities, actual or contingent, which shall have arisen during the Term of this Agreement, shall survive any

termination of this Agreement.

Section 14. Headings.

The headings in this Agreement are for convenience only and are not a part of this Agreement. The headings do not in any way define, limit, describe or amplify the provisions of this Agreement or the scope or intent thereof.

Section 15. Non-Waiver.

Nothing contained herein relating to the rights and obligations between the parties hereto shall be deemed to be a waiver of the rights, immunities, and limitations that the Licensee enjoys under the provisions of state law.

Section 16. No Construction Against Drafting Party.

No provision of this Agreement shall be construed against or interpreted to the disadvantage of either Licensor or Licensee by any court or other governmental or judicial authority by reason of such party having or being deemed to have drafted, structured or dictated such provision.

Section 17. Relationship.

Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to render or constitute Licensor or Licensee in any way or for any purpose to be a partner, joint venturer or associate in any relationship with the other party nor shall this Agreement be construed to authorize either Licensor or Licensee to act as agent for the other party except as expressly provided in this Agreement.

Section 18. Waiver.

The failure of either party to insist upon strict performance of any of the terms or provisions of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver or as a relinquishment for the future of such term, provision, option, right or remedy. No waiver by either party of any term or provision of this Agreement shall be deemed to have been made unless expressed in writing and signed by such party.

Section 19. Binding Effect.

This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding on the parties and their respective legal representatives, successors, successors-in-title and assigns.

Section 20. Amendments.

This Agreement and its provisions may be changed, waived, discharged or terminated only by an instrument in writing executed by both parties.

Section 21. Severability.

If any provision of this Agreement or the application of any provision to any person or circumstance is or becomes invalid or unenforceable to any extent, then the remainder of this Agreement and the application of such provisions to any other person or circumstances shall not be affected by such invalidity or unenforceability and shall be enforced to the greatest extent permitted by law.

Section 22. Counterparts.

This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original and all of which together shall comprise but a single document.

Section 23. Entire and Final Agreement.

This Agreement represents the entire agreement between Licensor and the Licensee as to the subject matter of this Agreement and there are no collateral or oral agreements or understandings. This Agreement shall not be modified in any manner except by an instrument in writing executed by Licensor and the Licensee.

Section 24. Limitation of Rights.

Nothing contained in this Agreement is intended, nor shall be construed, to create any rights in the general public or in any parties other than those parties specifically designated in this Agreement.

Section 25. Governing Law.

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed according to the laws of the State of Texas, and enforced only in state or federal courts located in Wilson County.

Section 26. Dispute Resolution.

If a dispute arises between the Parties arising from or relating to this Agreement, the following alternative dispute resolution procedure shall be used prior to any Party filing suit. A Party may initiate dispute resolution by delivering written notice to the other Parties, stating a description of the dispute; an initial meeting shall be held promptly thereafter among the Parties to attempt in good faith to negotiate a resolution of the dispute. If, within thirty (30) days after the initial meeting, the parties have not reached a written agreement resolving the dispute, any interested Party may require that the dispute

be submitted to non-binding mediation, to be held within the boundaries of Wilson County before a mutually acceptable mediator. All Parties will participate in good faith. An initial notice of dispute may be amended or supplemented, and another Party may deliver a counter notice, prior to the conclusion of mediation. If the dispute is not resolved within one hundred and twenty (120) days after the initiating notice of dispute was delivered to all Parties, any Party may proceed to file suit on the disputes stated in the notices.


Section 27. Notice.

Whenever a notice is required under the terms of this Agreement, delivery of such notice shall be deemed completed when it is actually delivered in hand, or by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the receiving party addressed to its authorized agent, at the address for service stated with its signature to this Agreement. or to such other address for service that the party may designate by notice from time to time. A notice may also be delivered by electronic transmission to the electronic address of the authorized agent by a means that creates proof of delivery. A notice delivered after regular office hours or on a weekend or State holiday will be effective on the next day that is not a weekend or State holiday. As used in this section, "an authorized agent" means, for the Licensee, Wayne Robbins, Owner; and for the Licensor, the Mayor, City Secretary or City Administrator.
