

#### Ordinance No. 032119-01

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 12 OF THE CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES, TO ADD ENGINE-EXHAUST BRAKING (JAKE BREAKING) IN THE CITY LIMITS; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of La Vernia approved adopted Ordinance Number 121108-01, which has since been codified in Chapter 14 of the City's Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the City of La Vernia City Council has determined that an ordinance is necessary to stop all Engine-Exhaust braking within the city limits, and;

WHEREAS, the City Council finds it to be reasonable and necessary to amend Chapter 12 to regulate diesel engine braking; NOW THEREFORE

# NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNIA, TEXAS:

**ARTICLE 1.** That Chapter 12, adding Section 201 Engine-Exhaust Braking, is amended as set forth in the attached Exhibit A.

#### ARTICLE 2. RELATION TO OTHER ORDINANCES.

This ordinance shall not be construed to require or allow any act which is prohibited by any other ordinance.

#### **ARTICLE 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

This ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication as required by law.

#### **ARTICLE 4. SAVINGS CLAUSE.**

The repeal or amendment of any ordinance or part of ordinances effectuated by the enactment of this ordinance shall not be construed as abandoning any action now pending under or by virtue of such ordinance or as discontinuing, abating, modifying, or altering any penalty accruing or to accrue or as affecting any rights of the City of La Vernia under any section or provisions of any ordinances in effect at the time of passage of this ordinance.

#### **ARTICLE 5. CUMULATIVE.**

The provisions of this ordinance shall be cumulative of all ordinances not repealed by this ordinance and ordinances governing or regulating the same subject matter as that covered

herein. This ordinance shall not be construed to require or allow any act which is prohibited by any other ordinance.

#### **ARTICLE 6. SEVERABILITY.**

City of La Vernia

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and section of this ordinance be severable, and, if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this ordinance shall be declared invalid by judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or sections of this ordinance and the remainder of this ordinance shall be enforced as written.

#### ARTICLE 7. PROPER NOTICE AND MEETING.

It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was passed was open to the public and that public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551 of the Texas Government Code. Notice was also provided as required by Chapter 52 of the Texas Local Government Code.

#### **EXHIBIT A**

Chapter 12, Section 201 – Definitions and Section 202 - Specific prohibitions

Sec. 12-201. - Definitions.

ADD:

As used in this article, the following works and terms shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, unless the context of their usage clearly indicates another meaning:

Engine-exhaust breaking system shall mean a compression release engine brake devise which converts diesel engine power into an air compressor and when engaged operates to slow the vehicle.

#### ADD:

#### Sec. 12-202. – Specific prohibitions.

The following acts, among others, are declared to be loud, disturbing or unnecessary noises in violation of this article but such enumeration shall not be constructed to be exclusive of other noises:

- a. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the terms of this ordinance are hereby repealed; provided, however, that such repeal shall be only to the extent of such inconsistency and in all other respects this ordinance shall be cumulative of other ordinances regulating and governing the subject matter covered by this ordinance.
- b. If any provision, section exception, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance or the application of same to any person or the set of circumstances, shall for any reason be held unconstitutional, void or invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this ordinance or their application to other persons or sets of circumstances and to this end all provisions of this ordinance are declared to be severable.
- c. Any person who fails to comply with any provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding TWO THOUSAND AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$2000.00). Each act of violation shall occur shall constitute a separate offense. In addition to the penalty prescribed above, the city may pursue other remedies such as abatement of nuisances, injunctive relief, administrative adjudication and revocation of licenses or permits.
- d. This ordinance shall take effect from and after ten (10) days from its passage by the City Council. The City Clerk is hereby directed to give notice hereof by causing the caption of this ordinance to be published in the official newspaper of the City of La Vernia at least twice within ten (10) days after passage of this ordinance.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 032119-02**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNIA, TEXAS APPOINTING A MUNICIPAL COURT JUDGE AND ESTABLISHING THE FEES FOR SERVICE TO BE PAID THE MUNICIPAL COURT JUDGE FOR SERVICES PERFORMED; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of La Vernia has an ordinance providing for the appointment and oversight of a municipal court judge and alternate judge for the municipal court of the City; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 20, Section 20-101 and 20-102 of the La Vernia Code of Ordinances regulates the term of office, appointment and reappointment of municipal judges in accordance with state law provisions in Texas Government Code Chapter 29; and

**WHEREAS**, the City desires to adjust the fees paid for service for the office of Municipal Court Judge.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNIA, TEXAS:

**Part 1**. That pursuant to state law and the La Vernia Code of Ordinances, the term of Municipal Court Judge is two years and the current judge, Judge Stephen Barrera was last appointed on January 9<sup>th</sup> 2018 for a term to expire on January 9<sup>th</sup> 2020.

Part 2. That during said term, the fees for services provided by Judge Barrera shall be in accordance with the fee schedule attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Part 3. All other conflicting ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent they are in conflict.

**Part 4**. If any provision of this ordinance shall be held void or unconstitutional, it is hereby provided that all other parts of the same which are not held void or unconstitutional shall remain in full force and effect.

Part 5. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage, approval and official publication as provided by law.
